

NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF AYURVEDA

The National Institute of Ayurveda, established on 7-2-1976, is an apex Institute under the Department of AYUSH, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India for promoting the growth and development of Ayurveda as a model Institute and for evolving high standards of teaching, training, research and patient care and also to invoke scientific outlook to the knowledge of Ayurveda System of Medicine.

The Institute has a glorious tradition of more than 143 years when the Department of Ayurveda was started in 1865 in the Maharaja Sanskrit College, Jaipur which gained popularity as the "Jaipur School of Thought". An independent Ayurvedic College was established in August 1946 by the Government of Rajasthan and this College in the country to start Post-Graduate Education in Ayurveda way back in 1970.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

1. To promote the growth and development of Ayurveda.
2. To produce graduates and post-graduates in all branches of Ayurveda.
3. To conduct research on various aspects of Ayurveda.
4. To provide medical care through Ayurvedic System of Medicine to the suffering humanity.
5. To provide and assist in providing service and facilities of the highest order for research evaluation, training, consultation and guidance to Ayurvedic System of Medicine.
6. To conduct experiments and develop patterns of teaching undergraduate and post-graduate education in all branches of Ayurveda.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL CONTROL

The Institute is under the overall administrative and financial control of the Government of India and is fully financed by it. The apex managing Body of the Institute is a 16 Member Governing Body president over by the Hon'ble Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare. The Vice-President is the Hon'ble Minister for Ayurveda/Health of Rajasthan. The other Members are: Secretary, Joint Secretary and Advisor (Ayurveda) of the Department of AYUSH, Govt. of India, the Additional Secretary (FA) of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Secretary (Finance) Secretary (Ayurveda) and Director of Ayurveda of Government of Rajasthan and 4 Ayurvedic Experts nominated by the Govt. of India and 2 by the Govt. of Rajasthan and the Director of the Institute is the Member Secretary of the Governing Body. There is also a Standing Finance Committee presided over by the joint secretary, Department of AYUSH, Govt. of India for considering and clearing various financial matters.

RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

The post Graduate and Ph.D. Scholar are allotted Research Works of various aspects of Ayurveda including literacy research. Some Teachers are also involved in Collaborative Research with various organization, institutions and industries like CCRAS, Ranbaxy Laboratories, Medical College, renowned Hospitals, and Universities etc.

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION

International Collaboration in the field of Ayurvedic Teaching, Training, Research, Standardization of Drugs, Accreditation/Certification of Ayurveda System of Medicine, Publication etc. has also been initiated with the University of Connecticut, School of Medicine, USA, Naturafarm GmbH of Germany and Institute of Ayurvedic Medicine, St. Petersburg, Russia, MOU has also been signed with these Institutions and visit to these Institutions has also been undertaken These activities are progressing.

PATIENT CARE ACTIVITIERS

HOSPITAL 241 BEDS WITH OPD (5 Cottage Wards)

Facilities: Pathological and Biochemical Investigations, X-Ray, Dental Unit, Audiometer, Sonography, ECG,TMT, Eye Clinic, Cancer Clinic Orthopaedic Clinic, Yoga Unit etc.

Panchakarma Hospital: There is a separate well-equipped and beautiful Panchakarma Hospital for various Panchakarma therapies like Snehana, Swedana, Vamana, Virechana, Anuvasana Basti, Asthapana Basti & Nasya Karma etc.

Para-Surgical Procedures: Kshara Sutra, Jalokavacharana, Agnikarma, Siravedha, Dantotpatana Vranopachara etc.

Medical Camps in SC and ST Areas: Organises Medical Camps in SC and ST inhabited areas of various Districts of Rajasthan and Free Consultation and Medicines dispensed. During the last 6 years about 2.25 lakh patients were treated in about 625 Campus.

Speciality Clinics: Diabetic Clinic, Geriatric Clinic, Dietary Clinic, Child Mental Health Clinic and Allergy Clinic are also available in the Hospital for specialized consultation and treatment facilities.

Tele-Medicine: Tele-Medicine program has also been launched from 3 Divisional Headquarters of Rajasthan (Jodhpur, Udaipur and Kota) More cities and towns will be covered in this Prot very soon.

Satellite Clinic: The First satellite Hospital was launched at Jawahar Nagar, a commercially and residentially important locality of Jaipur. The Institute has plan to open more satellite Hospital in various areas of the City to extend patient care activities to more areas so that the citizens can easily benefit from the patient care service of the Institute without traveling all the way to the main Campus.

Centre of Excellence for Eye diseases: An Eye Clinic, NIA-Sreedhareeyam Ayurvedic Centre of Excellence for Eye Diseases, with technical Collaboration of Sreedhareeyam Ayurvedic Eye Hospital and Research Centre of Ernakulam was launched in the Institute. This Centre is providing treatment for various eye diseases. Many patients from the north and western parts of the country who had to travel to Kerala for this specialized Ayurvedic Treatment for Eye Diseases are now coming to the Institute for treatment. An Eye Specialist and Para-medical Staff deputed from Sreedhareeyam are manning this Centre where specialized medicines procured from Sreedhareeyam are dispensed to patients.

Practice Based Advanced Ayurvedic Clinical Documentation Program: The Institute launched a Practice Based Advanced Ayurvedic Clinical Documentation Program in technical collaboration with AVT Institute of Advanced Research of The Ayurvedic Trust, Coimbatore. This Advanced Program will help to evolve standards for patient care and computerize documentation of treatment of patients for building an Evidenced Based for Ayurveda and for establishing a Comprehensive Documentation System for the Hospital for Evaluating Clinical Practice for Ayurveda which will, in the long run, create an Evidence Base for Ayurvedic Treatment in the Institute. This will go a long

way in establishing the need for creating an Evidence Base for Ayurveda for market authorization of Ayurvedic products in foreign countries.

VISIT OR FOREIGN DELEGATIONS

Delegation from various countries visit the Institute for studying and getting knowledge on Ayurveda for introducing Ayurveda in their countries. Delegations from USA, Russia, Germany, South Korea, Mongolia, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Italy, China, Malaysia etc. visited this Institute in recent times and discussed various proposals for initiation of collaborative programs in education, research etc. with NIA.

The Director of the Institute visited Russia, China, Hungary, and Germany etc. for representing the Government of India for discussing various collaborative programs in Ayurveda.

More than a dozen faculty members visited various countries like USA, UK, Russia, China, Japan, South Korea, Sri Lanka etc, under WHO sponsored Fellowship Programs and also as representative of the Govt. of India for propagation of Ayurveda. Similarly the Institute had been receiving WHO Fellows from these countries for getting training and knowledge in Ayurveda. The WHO had been sponsoring Fellows to the Institute for training since the last many years. Some more faculty members have recently been selected for WHO Fellowship Program in some countries for which they will be deputed soon.
