PREFACE

With due respects, I submit to present the Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts of the National Institute of Ayurveda for the year 2016-2017 highlighting various activities of the Institute undertaken during the reported year. The Institute has achieved significant growth in teaching, training and patient care activities. Best efforts were made to propagate, progress, develop and enrich the Institute for the welfare of mankind.

It gives me immense pleasure to inform that the Institute Hospital has been granted **NABH Accreditation by the National Accreditation Board for Hospitals & Healthcare Providers. The Institute is in the process of obtaining NAAC and NABL Accreditation very soon.**

The Institute, along with National Ayurveda Students & Youth Association(NASYA) achieved a **Guinness World Record for the Most People Receiving Nasya Panchakarma Treatment Simultaneously.** This grand event was organized in the presence of around 3000 participants during the 1st Rashtriya Ayurved Yuva Mahotsav held in the Institute.

The 1st Rashtriya Ayurved Yuva Mahotsav was jointly organized by National Ayurveda Students and Youth Association (NASYA) and NIA was organized in the Institute. The Festival was supported by Ministry of AYUSH. The Festival was inaugurated by Shri Sripad Yasso Naik, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for AYUSH. The 3-day Festival was graced by Justice Shri S.S. Kothari, Lokayutha of Rajasthan, Shri Kalicharan Sharraf, Hon'ble Minister for Medical, Health & Ayurveda of Rajasthan, Shri Ramcharan Bohra, Hon'ble MP, Shri Surendra Pareek, Hon'ble MLA, Vaidya Shri Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, Ministry of AYUSH, Dr. Manoj Nesari, Adviser(Ayurveda), Dr. R. Vanitha, President, CCIM, Shri A Jayakumar, Secretary-General, Vijnana Bharati, Prof. Radhey Shyam Sharma, Vice-Chancellor of Rajasthan Ayurved University etc. Around 2700 delegates drawn from 93 Ayurvedic Colleges and other Ayurvedic Organisations participated in the event. All the 4 Ayurvedic Universities in the country, namely Gujarat Ayurved University, Rajasthan Ayurved University, Uttarakhand Ayurved University and the Ayurvedic University of Hoshiarpur were partners. The Festival showcased the hidden talents and skills of the Ayurvedic Graduates and Post-Graduates not only in Ayurveda but in other extra-curricular domain also. A number of Quiz Programs, Competitions and Cultural Programs were conducted.

An MOU was signed with Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman, Kaula Lumpur, Malaysia for collaboration in the field of Education, Training, Research, Publication and Popularization of Ayurveda in Malaysia. This MOU will help the Institute to project its potentials in the field of Ayurvedic Education, Training, Patient Care Activities, especially the popular Panchakarma and Kshara-Sutra Therapies.

A Team of 25 Drug Regulators from African Countries visited the Institute to understand and to know the working of the Institute. They were shown the varied activities like Teaching, Training, Research, Patient Care Activities and also Drug Manufacturing Process.

11 Students along with the President, Director and Faculty Member of Jeong Hwa Art University from South Korea visited the Institute for getting Training on the Basics of Ayurveda. They were given a 5-Day Training by organizing Lectures by Teachers of NIA on Theory & Practicals on the Fundamentals of Ayurveda which was followed by a Test. All the students cleared the Test successfully and Certificates were provided. Feed-back was obtained. The Team expressed satisfaction on the Training and arrangements made by the Institute.

An International Conference on the Scope and role of Ayurveda in the Management of Madhumeha (Diabetes Mellitus):Sambhasha was organized during the reported year. The International Day of Yoga and National Ayurveda Day was organized in a befitting manner.

A Special Meeting of the Governing Body of the Institute was held under the Chairmanship of Shri Shripad Yesso Naik, Hon'ble Minister of State for AYUSH (Independent Charge) to discuss changes in the Memorandum of Association and Bye-Laws of the Institute in order to empower Governing Body for establishment of a National Institute of Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy (AIAY&N) at Panchkula (Haryana) as an Extension of NIA, Jaipur.

The Institute has got registered with the PFMS System and Payments are being made through PFMS.

As part of its program on human resources development in various academic courses, admissions were made to 90 seats in the Under-Graduate Course of BAMS, 103 seats in the Post-Graduate Courses of MD/MS(Ayurveda), 30 seats in the Diploma Course of AYUSH Nursing & Pharmacy and 18 seats in the Panchakarma Attendant Course. Candidates from Russia, Iran, Nicaragua, Tanzania, Bhutan, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Thailand, Nepal and Bangladesh were admitted to UG and PG Courses.

The Institute launched E-Hospital Services during the year. A De-addiction Unit was launched for managing and treating patients addicted to tobacco use, drinking etc. The patient care activities continued excellently and the total number of patients treated in OPD was 2,33,805 out of which 1,46,532 were new. 78,570 Patients were treated in the 300 Bedded Hospital IPD out of which 5,629 were new. The Institute also organizes regular Medical Camps in a dozen SC and ST inhabited Districts of Rajasthan under SCP & TSP Schemes. Medical Camps along with health awareness programs were also organised in and around Jaipur City. During the year, 50 Camps were organized in which 48,871 Patients were treated, consultations and medical check-up were given and free medicines were dispensed.

The GMP Certified Pharmacy of the Institute produces Medicines required for the Hospitals and also to meet the needs of research activities of PG, Fellowship Programs and also research of teachers. During the year, 130 Types of Medicines (41,370 Kg.) worth Rs. 1,32,47,957 were manufactured. This is 2,784 kg. more than last year's production. The Institute is making all efforts to increase the production every year to meet the requirements of Hospital, Research etc. The Pharmacy is being run in 2 Shifts.

The Institute provides Hostel Accommodation in its 6 Hostels located in the Campus with 440 Seats, available for UG, PG and Ph.D. separately for Girls and Boys.

The Library of the Institute has been shifted to the new building. The Library has a collection of 28,000 Text Books, subscription of 115 Journals and Newspapers. 2,616 Annual Volumes of Journals are available for reference and research purposes. The Book Bank has 7,531 books for the use of students on merit-cum-need basis. The Library is being enriched every year by adding more Books, Journals etc. Departmental Libraries also exist in all the Departments for easy and immediate reference by teachers and scholars. The process of starting E-Library is in progress.

The Institute has good infrastructure like Buildings for Academic, Hospitals, Hostels, Pharmacy, Office, Laboratory, Cottage and Cubical Wards, Auditorium etc. in the 12 acres Campus apart from the City Hospital housed in a 1300 Square Meter land in the heart of the City.

The Ministry of AYUSH provides all the required funds for the Institute every year to meet the Non-Plan and Plan Expenditures. During the year, the Ministry provided Rs. 3168.28 Lakhs in Non-Plan and Rs. 2355.10 Lakhs in Plan for various activities.

In the coming days, the Institute proposes to undertake the following activities so that the Institute may attain a name of its own not only in the country, but internationally also as a centre of excellence in the field of Ayurvedic learning:

- Achieving the Status of Centre of Excellence in Ayurvedic Education and Training.
- Achieving the Status of an Institute of International Importance by establishing the Institute under an Act of Parliament.
- Fully functional Institute to award Degrees and Diploma on its own.
- Increasing the BAMS Seats from the present 92 to 100 annually.
- NABL Accreditation.
- NAAC Accreditation.
- Launching the proposed National Institute of Ayurveda & Yoga at Panchkula(Haryana).
- Launching E-Learning Courses for domestic and foreign nationals for learning Ayurveda.
- Further Strengthening the Foreigner Exposure Training Programs for Foreign Medical and Non-Medical Professionals.
- International Collaboration with Foreign Countries in the field of Ayurvedic Teaching, Training, Publications, Research, Exchange of Experts and Students etc.
- Launching of WHO Collaboration Center.

- Development of Teaching Modules.
- Launching of 1 Year Panchakarma Technician Course.
- High Impact Scientific Research, Publications in National and International Reputed Journals.
- Patent Process: This will have wide applicability and marketability.
- Use of Best Brains from allied Subjects of reputed institutions utilising their state-of-the-art facilities for advanced Teaching, Training, Patient Care and High Impact Research.
- Fully implementing the provisions of MOU entered with Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman, Malaysia for providing Ayurvedic Teaching, Training, Publications etc.
- Fully implementing the provisions of MOU entered with CCRAS for carrying out Multi-Centric Research Project entitled "Validation of Prakriti Assessment Questionnaire/Scale"
- Organising National and International Seminars/Conferences on various topics.
- Accelerating E-Hospital Services and facilities.
- To start IPD Services in the Tribal Hospital launched with OPD Services recently.
- Launching Speciality Clinics and Best Practices in the Hospital.
- Launching a well equipped state of the art Panchakarma and Kshara Sutra Units.
- Enormous Data Collection of Experimental and Clinical Leads in the field of Ayurveda.
- Streamlining this Data to identify leads for further research.
- Increasing Production in the Pharmacy to meet total requirement of Hospital and Research.
- Launching Advanced Drug Testing & Quality Control Laboratories.
- Launching Advanced Clinical Laboratory on PPP Model.
- All the Teaching Departments, Laboratories, Hospitals, Pharmacy etc. will be enriched by procuring more machineries and equipments to streamline various activities.
- The whole Hospital Complex is being renovated.
- Increasing the OPD Dispensing Counters for easy dispensing and to reduce the time consumed by patients in getting the prescribed medicines.
- Starting Animal Research for which Animal House is being constructed.
- Construction for a Multi-Storey Building in the City for a World Class Hospital.
- Construction for New OPD Building in the Campus for improved Hospital Services.
- Construction of a Multi-Storey Building for Central Laboratory and Deluxe/Cottage Wards.
- Construction for Foreigners Hostel and Guest House and Space of Indoor Games.
- Construction for a New Operation Theatre Complex.

With all these services, facilities, infrastructure suiting to a national level institution, the Institute is marching forward to achieve various goals set by the Ministry of AYUSH, especially in the upgradation of education, training and patient care activities in order to project Ayurveda globally as the strong System of Medicine in the world.
