Course Scope

Methodologies used for the easy procurement of the Ayurveda herbs will be discussed. Particular attention will be given to the unique *Ayurvedic* principles and their application in references to particular *prakriti* (Skin type, Hair type etc) of the individual. Participants will also be trained regarding different management issues while setting up a beauty clinic and will be acquainted with various related legal issues. Participants will be given a therapeutic guideline related to the diseases of skin, hair and other cosmetic areas which will include both medications as well as *Ayurvedic* procedures.
