PREFACE

With due respects, I submit to present the Annual Report and the Audited Statement of Accounts of the National Institute of Ayurveda for the financial year 2017-2018 highlighting various activities of the Institute undertaken during the year. The Institute has achieved significant growth in teaching, training and patient care activities. Best efforts were made to propagate, strengthen, progress, develop and enrich the Institute for the welfare of mankind.

It gives me immense pleasure to inform that the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India has decided and approved to establish a National Institute of Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy at Panchkula, Haryana as an Extension Center of NIA. This is a milestone in the history of the Institute and recognition to its varied activities in the field of Ayurvedic Education, Training and Patient Care Activities all these four decades and as a national and international entity. A 20 acres Land has already been handed over to NIA by Shri Mata Mansa Devi Shrine Board of Panchkula on lease. M/s. WAPCOS Ltd., an Undertaking of Ministry of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation, Govt. of India has been appointed Project Management Consultant for establishing the proposed Institute.

l am also happy to submit that with the approval of the Ministry of AYUSH, Application has been submitted to Ministry of Human Resource Development for grant of Deemed-to-be-University Status to NIA. Similarly, Application for NAAC Accreditation has also been submitted.

The Institute shouldered the responsibility for organizing WHO Working Group Meetings for Reviewing WHO Documents Benchmark for Practice in Ayurveda, Panchkarma and Unani System held on 17-19 September, 2018 at Jaipur. The 3-day programme containing four sessions on each day was organised by Ministry of AYUSH and coordinated by the Institute. WHO Officials and Experts and 39 Ayurveda and Unani Experts, representing 18 countries, participated in the Meetings.

The Ministry of AYUSH has been kind enough to enhance the annual in-take capacity from 92 to 100 for the BAMS Course. The Institute has launched One Year Panchakarma Technician Course. Short-Term Certificate Courses of 30 to 45 Days duration have also been launched in Training on Kshara Sutra, Standardization of Ayurvedic Medicinal Plant Materials, Beauty Care through Ayurveda, Primary Health Care through Kitchen Spices and Local Plants, Ayurvedic Methods of Cooking, Panchakarma Training to BAMS Doctors etc. This has wide attraction among the general public and Ayurvedic Doctors.

As part of its program on human resources development, admission was made to 84 seats in the Under-Graduate Course of BAMS, 104 seats in the Post-Graduate Courses of MD/MS(Ayurveda), 30 seats in the Diploma Course of AYUSH Nursing & Pharmacy and 19 seats in the Panchakarma Attendant Course. Candidates from Nepal and Sri Lanka were admitted to UG and PG Courses. The Ministry of AYUSH had been very kind enough to enhance the Stipends of PG and Ph.D. Scholars from 1-1-2016. Fees of all the Courses have also been increased.

A Workshop on Bringing Objectivity to Assessment Variables for Research in Ayurvedic Sking Care, Workshop-cum-Lecture on Stress Management for Intellectuals and Professionals, Workshop on Synopsis Writing, National Workshop-cum-Training Program on Cancer, Workshop on Standardization of Ushnadi Guna of Pitta, Lectures on the occasion of Womens Day, Lectures on Research Methodology, Beti-Bachho and many other topics were organized during the year. Resource Persons and Experts in the fields delivered Lectures and made Presentations. Teachers and Scholars participated in large number.

Many countries and foreign organizations are taking interest to send their delegations to the Institute for various purposes. 2 Teams of Drug Regulators from African Countries visited the Institute to understand and to know the working of the Institute. They were shown the varied activities like Teaching, Training, Research, Patient Care Activities and also Drug Manufacturing Process. The visit was part of India Africa Forum Summit and as envisaged by Hon'ble Prime Minister of India during the 3rd India-Africa Forum Summit. A Delegation of 2

Doctors from Montreal University of Canada visited the Institute to explore feasibility of launching Courses on Ayurveda in the University with the collaboration of NIA and held detailed interactions on various topics of Ayurveda also. Another German Teach also visited the Institute to understand Ayurvedic Teaching, training, research etc. Similarly, the Ministry of AYUSH has been deputing Director and Faculty Members of the Institute to various countries for creating awareness and popularization of Ayurveda. Director was deputed to Spain and Germany and three teachers were also deputed to Egypt, Mangolia and Bangkok.

The patient care activities continued excellently and the total number of patients treated in OPD was 2,61,664 out of which 1,69,923 were new patients. 67,848 Patients were treated at IPD level out of which 4,680 were new. The Institute also organizes regular Medical Camps in a dozen SC and ST inhabited Districts of Rajasthan under SCP & TSP Schemes. Medical Camps along with health awareness programs were also organized in and around Jaipur City. During the year, 102 Camps were organized in which 81,151 Patients were treated, consultations and medical check-up were given and free medicines dispensed.

The GMP Certified Pharmacy of the Institute produces Medicines required for the Hospitals and also to meet the needs of research activities of PG, Fellowship Programs and also research of teachers. During the year, 293 Types of Medicines (48,427 Kg.) worth Rs. 2,04,78,079 were manufactured. This is 7,057 Kg. more than last year's production. The Institute is making all efforts to increase the production every year to meet the requirements of Hospital, Research etc. The Pharmacy is operated in 2 Shifts.

The Library has a collection of 28,000 Text Books, subscription of 115 Journals and Newspapers. 2,616 Annual Volumes of Journals are available for reference and research purposes. The Book Bank has 7,531 books for the use of students on merit-cum-need basis. The Library is being enriched every year by adding more Books, Journals etc. Departmental Libraries also exist in all the Departments for easy and immediate reference by teachers and scholars. RFID Automation Solutions for Library Management System is being installed in the Library very soon.

The ongoing construction work for New OPD Building is progressing. Installations for CCTV in the whole Campus, Video Conferencing, Recording, E-Office Project, Gymnasium for Students, etc. are also being taken up soon.

The Institute provides Hostel Accommodation in its 6 Hostels located in the Campus with 440 Seats, available for UG, PG and Ph.D. separately for Girls and Boys.

The Ministry of AYUSH provides all the required funds for the Institute every year to meet various Expenditures. During the year, the Ministry provided Rs. 7141 Lakhs and the Actual Expenditure was Rs. 7,532 Lakhs.

In the coming days, the Institute proposes to undertake the following activities so that the Institute may attain a name of its own not only in the country, but internationally also as a centre of excellence in the field of Ayurvedic learning:

- Achieving Status of a Deemed-to-be-University and NAAC Accreditation. Applications have already been submitted.
- Achieving Center of Excellence.
- Launching WHO Collaboration Center.
- Establishing National Institute of Ayurveda, Yoga & Naturopathy at Panchkula. Process already started.
- Strengthening Ayurvedic Exposure Training Programs for Foreign Medical and Non-Medical Professionals.
- International Collaboration with foreign countries/organizations in Ayurvedic Teaching, Training, Publications, Research, Exchange of Faculty and Scholars.
- High Impact Scientific Research, Publications in National and International reputed Journals.
- Use of Best Brains from allied Subjects of reputed institutions utilizing their state-of-the-art facilities for advanced Teaching, Training, Patient Care and High Impact Research.
- Organising National and International Seminars/Conferences on various topics.
- Accelerating E-Hospital Services and Facilities.
- Launching of IPD Services in the Tribal Hospital
- Launching Speciality Clinics and Best Practices in the Hospital.

- Well equipped state of the art Panchakarma and Kshara Sutra Units.
- Enormous Data Collection of Experimental and Clinical Leads in the field of Ayurveda.
- Streamlining this Data to identify leads for further research.
- Increasing Production in the Pharmacy to meet total requirement of Hospital and Research.
- Launching Advanced Drug Testing & Quality Control Laboratories.
- Launching Advanced Clinical Laboratory on PPP Model.
- A multi-storey Hospital Complex is coming up in the Campus for expansion of Hospital Services.
- The old City Hospital will be reconstructed for a world class Hospital with all services.
- Construction for Foreigners Hostel and Guest Houses.

With all these services, facilities, infrastructure suiting to a national level institution, the Institute is marching forward to achieve various goals set by the Ministry of AYUSH, especially in the upgradation of education, training and patient care activities in order to project Ayurveda globally as the strong System of Medicine in the world.
