At the outset Member Secretary, Shri Chandra Shekhar Sharma (Finance Officer I/C), welcomed the esteemed Chairman and Members. He then requested Chairperson for his opening remarks.

Prof. (Dr.) Sanjeev Sharma, Chairman FC welcomed all the esteemed members of the Finance Committee and extended his gratitude for their participation. In his opening remarks, he shared key achievements of the National Institute of Ayurveda (NIA), Jaipur: and informed about **NABH Accreditation**: NIA Jaipur successfully completed its third cycle of assessment under the NABH (National Accreditation Board for Hospitals & Healthcare Providers) accreditation process, reaffirming its commitment to quality healthcare services, **NABL Accreditation**: The institute also completed the of assessment under NABL (National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories), ensuring high standards in laboratory testing and diagnostics, **NCISM Ranking**: NIA Jaipur recently secured the first rank and Grade 'A' in the assessment conducted by NCISM (National Commission for Indian System of Medicine) through Quality Council of India (QCI), a remarkable achievement reflecting excellence in academic and healthcare standards and **Desh Ka Prakriti Parikshan Abhiyan**: The institute secured the first position in the Prakriti Parikshan Abhiyan, an initiative by the Ministry of Ayush, Government of India, further establishing its leadership in Ayurveda-based health assessments. It was also informed that recently a parliamentary sub-committee for the official languages also inspected the institute's working in Hindi. The sub-committee

highly appreciated the working of NIA in Hindi and gave the **Utkrishtata Praman Patra (Excellence Certificate)** to the institute. Prof. Sharma emphasized that these accomplishments are a testament to the institute's dedication to academic and healthcare excellence. He urged the committee members to continue their valuable guidance in furthering the institute's mission. Then the Chairman asked the Member Secretary to present the agenda items.

Shri Chandra Shekhar Sharma, Deputy Director and Finance Officer I/C NIA (Memb. Secy), then presented the Agenda Items for discussion and consideration:

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.1	To confirm the Minutes of the 12th Meeting of Finance Committee held on 15-10-2024.
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The Member Secretary informed that the approved minutes of the 12th FC meeting held on October 15, 2024, had been circulated to all esteemed members (NIA Letter No. F.10-61/2024-NIA/CC dated October 29, 2024), and there were no comments, observations, or objections received. However, since the current FC has newly been constituted in accordance with the updated UGC regulations and the MoA approved by the Ministry of Ayush, many members are participating for the first time. Therefore, the minutes were read to the assembly, and the approval of all members of the newly formed FC was also obtained, resulting in the confirmation of the minutes. Hence, the minutes were confirmed.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.2	To report Action Taken/Present Position on the Approvals/ Recommendations of the 12th Meeting of Finance Committee held on 15-10-2024.
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The Finance Officer (Member Secy) presented the Action Taken Report (ATR) on the recommendations made in the 12th Finance Committee Meeting held on 15-10-2024. The committee was informed that the institute has taken necessary actions on all the agenda items recommended by the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee noted the Action Taken Report and reviewed the progress on various agenda items of the previous meeting.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.3	Recommendation of Expenditure Guidelines for Self-Financed Certificate and Short-Term Courses.
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The Finance Committee reviewed the proposal and deliberated on the financial structure, expenditure categories, and governance measures outlined for these courses. After detailed discussions the FC made the following recommendations:

1. Such programs should be encouraged and every department separately or in collaboration should organise such programs. However, the routine teaching, patient care and research activities must not be affected by such programs.
2. Although the institutional support out of such programs should be kept open ended however, Initially the 20% of the total amount has to be deposited in the institute's revenue head. Later-on if some amount remains after meeting all the expenses should also be deposited in the institute's account. If the expenditure goes above the remaining amount then the organising department may ask for further release of the fund within the capping of above mentioned 20% deposited in the institute's account. The approval for such release will be by the Vice-chancellor.

3. Video recording of these programs (if required) should also be on actual basis and maximum should be upto Rs 5000/- day. However, it will depend that for how long the recording has been done on a particular day and amount should be decided accordingly keeping the upper cap as Rs. 5000/ day.
4. FC also suggested that institute should develop the revenue expenditure policy and should get it approved from the competent bodies and the Ministry should also be informed about that policy.
5. Whenever making the expenditure for such courses the GFRs, NCISM guidelines, NIA rules, UGC guidelines and other rules operational at that particular time must be followed and obeyed and the financial accountability should be regulated for such self-financed courses/programs.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.4	Recommendation for Fees for Apprentice & Internship Training for External Students.
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NIA being a pioneer institute of Ayurveda of Government of India is approached by the students, scholars and academicians from outside the institute for various exposures training programs. All these programs utilized the human resources and infrastructure of NIA. There is a strong need to charges some fee for such trainings etc. but NIA till now no structured policy is existing in NIA for the same. Hence, the agenda related to the framing the policy and recommending the fees/charges for apprentice and internship was put before the Finance Committee.

The Finance Committee reviewed the proposal and provided recommendations to ensure the sustainability and inclusivity of the fee structure while maintaining financial viability. The Committee recommended increasing the BAMS Internship Training Fee from ₹40,000 to ₹50,000 per student to align with rising operational costs and industry standards.

To promote inclusivity, the Committee suggested that a 25% fee relaxation be provided for students from SC, ST, EWS, and other eligible categories. Additionally, for project-based training, the Committee approved an additional cost structure, ensuring that all project-related expenses are entirely borne by the trainees.

These recommendations aim to balance financial sustainability while ensuring quality training opportunities for students from diverse backgrounds.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.5	Recommendation of Increased Reimbursement Limit for PG Scholars Attending Conferences.
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The Finance Committee reviewed the proposal and acknowledged the importance of research exposure for PG Scholars. It was also recommended that conference registration fees and related expenses should be covered from NIA's own revenue/Boy's Fund, rather than from the GIA-General fund. Finally, the FC recommended the increase of the reimbursement limit from 2000 to ₹3,000 maximum twice a year (i.e., total ₹6,000 per year per scholar).

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.6	Recommendation of Registration Fee and TA Reimbursement for Ph.D. Scholars.
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The Finance Committee recommended the revised reimbursement limit for Ph.D. Scholars, setting it at ₹3,000 per conference, with a maximum of two conferences per year, i.e. total ₹6,000 annually per scholar. This revision aligns with the existing reimbursement policy for PG Scholars. Additionally, it was recommended that conference registration fees and related expenses be covered from NIA's own revenue/Boy's Fund rather than from the GIA-General fund.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.7	Stipend Rules for In-Service Candidates Enrolled in PG Programs.
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The clause 12, sub-clause 12.7 of the NIA PG regulations states that ***"In-service Candidates shall have to draw salary from their parent institute only."*** Accordingly, the Committee recommends that all in-service candidates, including those from Rajasthan, should receive their study leave salary from their respective departments. They will not receive a stipend from the institute, as is currently the practice for other states (out of Rajasthan) in-service candidates, this will be applicable prospectively.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.8	Financial Recommendation for Educational Tour for DAN&P Students at National Institute of Ayurveda, Jaipur.
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The Finance Committee recommended the proposal " Financial Recommendation for Educational Tour for DAN&P Students at National Institute of Ayurveda, Jaipur" as proposed by the academic council of NIA. Faculty members accompanying students will be eligible for TA/DA as per institute/Govt. of India rules, charged under the Boys' Fund/ own generated revenue.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.9	Recommendation of TA, DA, and Fees for Capacity Building Programs for Contractual Faculty in IDS Departments.
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After detailed discussion, the Finance Committee reviewed and recommended the proposal for TA, DA, and Capacity Building Fees re-imbusement for contractual faculty in the Interdisciplinary Studies (IDS) Departments, with effect from the new contract. These conditions could also be incorporated into the tender document. Recognizing the importance of faculty development programs in enhancing teaching and research skills, the Committee recommended the proposed TA/DA structure and capacity-building fees, with expenses to be charged under the Grant-in-Aid-General budget head. Additionally, the Committee directed the institute to obtain relevant policy documents from institutions like AIIA (if existing) to ensure standardization and alignment with best

practices before final implementation. A policy must be framed for this purpose. It was suggested by the FC that Ministry should also be informed about this subject/policy for uniform implementation in all other Nis also if required.

It was suggested by the committee that to get/retain the talent on the position of Domain Expert Ayurveda Manuscripts (position no 3 in the above table), if required the person may be engaged as Assistant Professor in Maulik Siddhant Department and then he can be given the additional responsibility to work in Manuscriptology Department so that he can get the teacher code from the regulatory body and experience as well.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.11	To consider and recommend the Engagement of personnel for Estate department of NIA, Jaipur on contractual basis through outsourcing agency.
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The Finance Committee, after detailed deliberations, recommended engaging two (2) Electricians and two (2) Plumbers along with one (1) Carpenter, one Mason (1), and two (2) Helpers, on a contractual basis for 11 months and may be extended as per future requirements. This engagement will be for the maintenance and minor works in the institute. The engagement will be made in compliance with the Minimum Wages Act, and the expenditure will be charged under the Grant-in-Aid-General budget head. All the above positions will purely be on contractual basis through outsourcing agency.

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The Finance Committee reviewed the proposal and recommended the engagement of following personnel initially for a period of 11 months, extendable based on institutional needs. The Chairman emphasized that after engagement, personnel should be optimally utilized to ensure efficiency and cost-effectiveness in hospital operations.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.14	To establish a Panchakarma Cottage Tent Resort to provide a dedicated, Eco friendly, and cost-effective Panchkarma treatment and to promote Ayurveda Wellness Tourism and medical value Tourism.
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The Finance Committee reviewed the proposal that project will be launched initially for 2-3 years after establishment, with a detailed financial model, operational strategy, and revenue generation plan to be formulated before full-scale implementation. Additionally, the Committee recommended finalizing service rates, budget provisions, and other micro-level planning aspects to optimize revenue and ensure the project's long-term viability. After deliberation, the Finance Committee granted in-principle approval for the project and instructed that micro detailing of the project should be carried out, including a comprehensive financial model, operational plan, and projected revenue generation strategy, before final implementation.

Agenda Item No. FC. 13.15	To consider and recommend the Engagement of a Few IT related and Mediarelated manpower on Contractual Basis through Outsourcing agency for National Institute of Ayurveda, Panchkula.
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The Committee review the proposal and noted that the engagement of proposed personnel for NIA, Panchkula is essentially required for strengthening IT infrastructure, digital operations, and institutional branding, particularly with the expansion of the institute and after deliberation, the Finance Committee recommended the proposal of the engagement of the following personnel, ensuring compliance with the Minimum Wages Act and Ministry of AYUSH guidelines.

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The Finance Committee recommended the engagement of 11 personnel at NIA Panchkula on a contractual basis through outsourcing, as previously approved by the Vice-Chancellor in his capacity as Chairman of the Finance Committee. This engagement is essential to meet the Minimum Standard Requirements (MSR) of NCISM. The total annual financial outlay of ₹69,24,000, which will be charged under the Grant-in-Aid-General budget head.

Additionally, the Committee emphasized that the salary structure should not exceed that of NIA Jaipur, ensuring uniformity in compensation across both institutes. This measure aims to maintain financial discipline while aligning with existing norms and standards followed at NIA Jaipur:

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The Finance Committee reviewed the proposal for implementing a Residency Scheme at NIA, Deemed to be University, aligning with practices followed at BHU, AIIMS, JIPMER, PGIMER, and other modern medical institutes. The financial implication of ₹35.08 crores per year under GIA-General was noted. The Committee acknowledged the importance of transitioning from a stipendiary system to a residency model to enhance patient care, academic training, and institutional growth.

The Finance Committee approved the proposal in-principal and directed that the proposal must be submitted to the Ministry for further approval.
